### CDC Defines "Key Terms" for Contact Tracing

(WHO) additionally includes persons with direct physical contact with a probable or confirmed case, direct care for a patient with probable or confirmed COVID-19 disease without using proper personal, and other situations as indicated by local risk assessments.

Isolation refers to a strategy used to separate people infected with the SARS-CoV-2 virus (those with and without symptoms) from people who are not infected. The term is used here to refer to people who are isolated at home, a community care center (i.e., isolation shelter), or a health facility. In the home, anyone with COVID-19 symptoms or who has been diagnosed with the disease should separate themselves from in the home to reduce the risk of transmission to others in the household and should stay home until it is safe for them to be around others. This also includes people

who have signs and symptoms consistent with COVID-19, for whom test results are not yet or will not be available.

Quarantine refers to a strategy used to keep someone who might have been exposed to COVID-19, but does not know if he or she is infected, away from others. Quarantine helps prevent spread of disease that can occur before a person knows that he or she is infected. People in quarantine should stay home, separate themselves from others, monitor their health, and follow directions from their local public health authorities.

Case Investigator refers to someone who will interview the case, elicit names and contact information of the contacts to be monitored, and provide guidance and resources to support people who are in isolation. They may also be the person who initially notifies a patient of a positive test result.

Contact Tracer refers to someone who will notify contacts of their exposure and monitor them for 14 days. They will describe quarantine to the contacts, help connect contacts with social services and other support as needed, and commonly be the primary public health person for contacts to answer questions and address concerns.

For the purpose of this document, these two distinct roles are referenced. However, the roles and responsibilities of case investigator and contact tracer may overlap in some settings, and may change over the course of the response. For example, in some contexts, case investigators may be the ones who initially notify contacts of their exposure; this is commonly the case for household members of the case. In addition, these roles may have different titles in different places.

What a wonderful opportunity and memories of the Fair - I guess Youth Rodeos should be a part of rodeo [so youth] have stories to pass on.



## Rosebud Fair Babies

I was lucky enough to be born "chekpa" on the eve of Sunday, last day before the end of Rosebud Fair. The fervor of the American Indian Movement was in the air as I made my little path through the milky way and arrived (as quite a shock to my parents I must add) with my twin sister, Lisa.

Rosebud Fair in the 1970's and 1980's was unarguably the best time of the year for any kid, but when it was your birthday, and you are a twin, it was like having an extra Christmas.

Every adult that wanted to hang out with your parent found a \$5 or \$10 bill in their pocket for my sister and I. That was like giving chokecherries to a canner. There was never an end to the amount of carnival rides that my sister and I could ride.

There would have to be a list of wild or crazy experiences that come along with a lifetime of Rosebud Fair and Rodeo memories; and no, I'm not yet talking about my teenage years!

A list of the three (3) worst Rosebud Fair experiences before the age of 13 are:

1. On the way home from a long day at the rodeo in about 1979, we were riding

in a fancy little car with Don Chalmers and there was a long line all the way back to Mission. It was hot as it always is during the Fair, and I was happily eating a snowcone until Don had to slam on the brakes to save his pretty little car! My sister hit her nose on the dash, and I watched in horror as my Uncle Don took MY SNOWCONE and used it for LISA's BLOODY NOSE! The nerve!

2. I once rode the Bullet before I was really ready to ride the Bullet. I was so sick afterwards, which might have been okay, except my dad got sent home with all the kids so that my mom could stay with my Grandma Carrie Roubideaux Bordeaux at the powwow. When we got home, I don't think my dad really knew what to do; so he gave me molasses... and about ten minutes later I was on the road to a disgusting, but speedy recovery!

Nonetheless, I have spent an entire lifetime hating molasses.

3. I wanted to ride horse pretty bad when I was about eight or so, and so I found a friend of my dad's who was willing to saddle my horse at the rodeo for me.

Everything was fun while I was riding around and waving at my friends... until I hit the back stretch and realized that there was a reason that I wasn't allowed to ride horse with sneakers on; and that

my saddle was loose. One quick trip around the outside of the arena on a slipping saddle (and a foot through the stirrup) was about a rodeo in itself; and I couldn't even tell on myself after surviving the ordeal either!

Well, onto the best memories! These are far greater and involve so many of my lifetime friends. Some of my friends from Head Start joke about being friends "Since we were still saying, 'Ha-Buds!'" Most of my teenage friends can remember my chanting, "It's my birthday all weekend!"

If you asked me when my birthday was, I would always tell people it was that night. Then, when they saw me having fun the next day or evening, they would ask me if it was my birthday the day before; and I would remind them that my birthday began when the carnival got to the Fairgrounds; and ended at 6:00 A.M. on the Sunday of Rosebud Fair, because that was time to go home, as that was when I was actually born. **(Note for my kids: Because I was at church - They used to have midnight church.)**

I know we are all going to be missing a lot of annual events this year. It's feels like we've all been asked to give up one kidney at the same time. It's so not Tribal to not have a Fair in 2020!

But, with the challenges that we are facing this year, it is totally understandable that we have to make sacrifices. Maybe someone has a story about another time that there was no Fair.

Maybe someone can share some stories about challenges that we faced as a Sicangu Nation; or when we faced other hardships; or perhaps this is the only year this has ever been so.





about us in the future; caring for us and our tribe. Some examples of what I would like to see happening include: having colleges to come and speak with students, working with other communities to teach/provide traditional knowledge, creating mental health supports in communities through proper training, and hold the various tribal programs to their word by ensuring they provide the services they claim to. Sicangu Lakota Oyate Head Start/Early Head Start program would like to inform parents, staff and the public our back to school Re-opening Plans for the upcoming 2020-2021 school year. We have discussed options for the past three weeks and with input from staff and returning parents made a final decision to start our school year as planned on Monday September 14, 2020 with "At-Home Learning" for September and October and re-evaluate monthly thereafter.

Head Start At-Home Learning activities will consist of the following:

Teachers will provide learning packets in accordance with Creative Curriculum, One Step (Social Emotional Curriculum) and the Lakota Curriculum. At Home learning educational packets will be delivered weekly to Head Start families. Teachers will stay in contact with families via telephone calls, Messenger, Facebook and FaceTime no less than two times per week, which will be documented.

Zoom and Google weekly meetings are planned with parents, in addition to short videos provided by teachers with story time activities for children and parents to complete.

Head Start schedule is:





## RST EDUCATION - EDUCATION TASK FORCE

**PRESS RELEASE**  
 Given recent communications with stakeholders and families, the RST Education Department recommends that families who opt for remote learning options still register their children

with their preferred school. Given the current impact of COVID-19, RST leadership, the RST Education department and school district representatives are working together to provide on-line learning options to all registered students. While homeschooling is an available option, this requires the parents to be responsible for providing home-based instruction that meets State requirements instead of the school district's licensed teacher. RST Education Department is advocating during this time of COVID, for parents to register their students with a local school district to have access to instruction with a certified teacher whether in-person or online/virtual/remote learning

Further, the RST Education Department will work towards providing information and resources to families on how to provide technological assistance at home so students can have access to remote learning options provided by the school districts. Additionally, health and safety information and resources will be made available (for example, how to effectively wear personal protective equipment for long periods of time, how to adequately follow social distancing guidelines). This is to ensure that, whenever it is deemed safe for school districts to return to any degree of in-person teaching, families, students and staff are protected against contracting COVID-19 through community spread to the maximum extent possible.

Due to the resurgence of Covid 19 across the country, the State of Emergency declared for the Rosebud Sioux Tribe has been extended to August 31, 2020.

The Corona Virus continues to be a deadly threat to us. We have experienced the impact of Covid 19 on our daily lives. Some families have been impacted more than others and have shared the pain they have been through. As a tribal government, we must act with compassion and do what we can to protect and help our tribal membership. We must help as much as we can with the resources we have available.

I want to acknowledge and express my appreciation for the dedication and commitment of those tribal employees and volunteers who have continued to provide services to the people. Like the employees of the Commodity Food Services who continue to keep their schedule moving to provide food to the families they serve. These employees practice the safety guidelines set out by the CDC which enables them to safely provide their services. Wopila tanka hetcha yelo. It is encouraging to see our Lakota values in action, compassion, dedication, generosity, bravery, perseverance.

We will continue in this State of Emergency with all tribal program offices open so the services to the people will not be adversely impacted. We will continue with restricted access by the public. The practice of allowing one person to enter, requiring masks, providing hand sanitizer, recording their temperature, asking the pertinent questions, calling the tribal employee to the front to meet with the visitor is an effort to protect the tribal employee as well as protecting the visitor so we will continue with this process.

Program directors will work out a schedule with their employees to keep their offices open without a disruption in service. Directors will work with the employees in their schedule with the July 24, 2020, memo in mind regarding the pay rates. Directors will provide their schedules to my office, Human Resources and Finance.
